Escambia County School District began 2007 with the daunting task of closing and redistricting 10 schools that affected more than 1,500 students for the new school year.

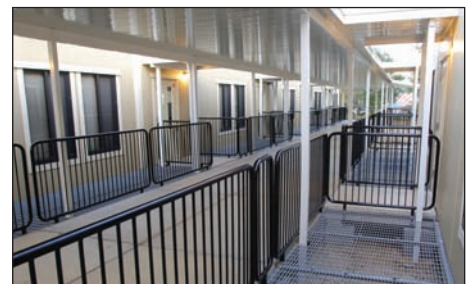
Client Need

Because the school expansions had to be complete in time for the new school year, timing was a major concern for the school district. Permanent modular construction was the best solution for providing the space needed in the time allowed. In all, six schools would be expanded, comprising a total of 51 new classrooms and ancillary space.

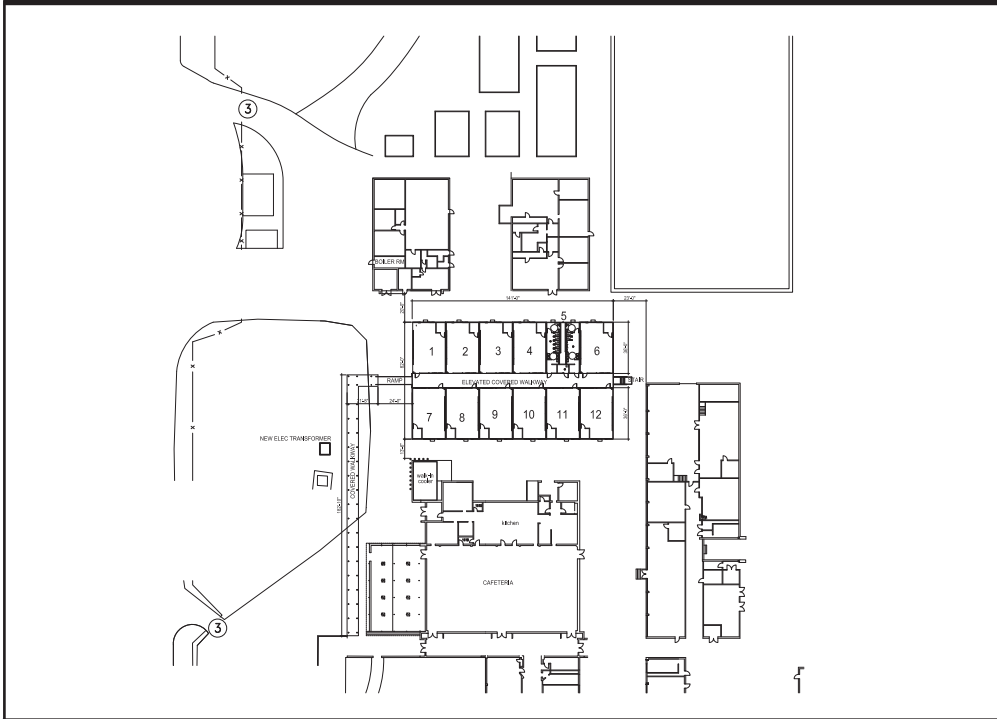
